Q38: Why did He suffer "under Pontius Pilate" as judge?

***A38: That He, being innocent, might be condemned by the temporal judge, and thereby deliver us from the severe judgment of God, to which we were exposed.***

Q39: Is there anything more in His having been "crucified" than if He had suffered some other death?

***A39: Yes, for thereby I am assured that He took upon Himself the curse which lay upon me, because the death of the cross was accursed of God.***

### **A Guide to the Evening Worship**

Thoughts on Worship – “The authenticating, inner essence of worship is being satisfied with Christ, prizing Christ, cherishing Christ, treasuring Christ. It encompasses all of life that flows from the heart. But it is tremendously relevant for understanding what worship services should be about. They are about ‘going hard after God.’ ... We are going hard after satisfaction in God, and going hard after God as our prize, and going hard after God as our treasure, our soul-food, our heart-delight, our spirit's pleasure. Or to put Christ in His rightful place – it means that we are going hard after all that God is for us in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen.” (John Piper)

### A Guide to the Morning Service

The Reading of Holy Scripture – At Grace Presbyterian Church, the Bible is our only rule for faith and practice. We love to sing the Bible and pray the Bible, and we especially love to read and preach the Bible. Paul commanded Timothy, “*Until I come, give attention to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation and teaching*” (1 Tim. 4:13), and so it is our habit to read substantial portions of God’s word in our services. We believe that “*the Spirit of God makes the reading, but especially the preaching of the word, an effectual means of enlightening, convincing, and humbling sinners; of driving them out of themselves, and drawing them unto Christ; of conforming them to his image, and subduing them to his will; of strengthening them against temptations and corruptions; of building them up in grace, and establishing their hearts in holiness and comfort through faith unto salvation*” (WLC #155). This morning, we begin reading through the book of Genesis. You can’t understand the Bible without understanding the book of Genesis. In it, we learn about the creation of the world, the worldwide flood, the call of Abraham, and the establishment of God’s covenant promises to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. May the Lord bless the reading and hearing of His word.

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs – The book of psalms is God’s divinely inspired hymnbook, and thus we seek to sing psalms along with scripturally sound hymns in all our services.

*O Worship the King* – This Robert Grant “hymn” is actually a paraphrase of Psalm 104. This psalm calls on us to praise God for His greatness, and for His tender care of all His creation – especially us, “frail children of dust, and feeble as frail.”

*What a Friend We Have in Jesus* – This familiar hymn by Joseph Scriven (who wrote it to comfort his mother) piles up encouragements and arguments to come to the Lord Jesus in prayer.

*As the Hart Longs* – Dr. Ligon Duncan writes of the second stanza, “By the very singing of this stanza we acknowledge to ourselves several things...: (1) the Christian life is often beset with almost unbearable grief; (2) many times our human support is lacking in these hard seasons and we must rely on God alone; and (3) there are times when we are so depleted and dry that we have to *recall* days of grace in order to endure.”
